 - Benevolent Dictator For Life
- stdlib
 - Standard Library
- committer
 - Someone who has commit privileges on CVS tree
- PEP
 - Python Enhancement Proposal

- Mailing lists
- SourceForge
- CVS

Communication

- `python-dev`
- `comp.lang.python` (`python-list`)
- `Python-checkins`
- `Patches`
- `Python-bugs-list`

SourceForge Usage

- Set fields properly
- Document any interactions with item in comments

Coding Standards

- C89 for C code
 - `pyconfig.h`
 - `Include/pyport.h`
- Style guidelines
 - PEP 7 for C
 - PEP 8 for Python

Changes to Python

- stdlib
 - adding functionality
 - changing functionality
 - adding a module
- Changing the language proper

stdlib: adding functionality

- Convince a committer that addition is good
 - Community support is good to have
- Have code ready
 - follow design guidelines
 - documentation
 - regression tests

stdlib: adding a module

- Be prepared to maintain code
- PEP possible
 - would require BDFL pronouncement or overwhelming python-dev/community support

stdlib: changing functionality

- Must prove breaking backwards-compatibility worth it
- Need python-dev/BDFL support

Changing Python Proper

- Write a PEP
- Convince python-dev/BDFL

Helping Out With...

- Bugs
 - write a patch
 - verify you have same problem on your system
 - run regression test and report any issues
- Patches
 - apply and run regression tests
 - comment on implementation

- Language Changes
 - state your opinion
- Community
 - help out on `comp.lang.python`
 - donate to the Python Software Foundation
